## FIRST READING OF HOUSE BILLS

The following bill was read the first time.

**H.F. No. 421:** A bill for an act relating to the energy assistance program; allowing the expenditure of certain federal funds.

Senator Moe, R.D. moved that H.F. No. 421 be laid on the table. The motion prevailed.

## REPORTS OF COMMITTEES

Senator Moe, R.D. moved that the Committee Reports at the Desk be now adopted. The motion prevailed.

**Senator Ranum from the Committee on Crime Prevention, to which was referred**

**S.F. No. 98:** A bill for an act relating to fire safety; requiring the state fire marshal to adopt rules for fire-retardant standards for cigarettes; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 299F.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

"Section 1. [299F.90] [CIGARETTE FIRE SAFETY.]

Subdivision 1. [STANDARDS.] (a) The commissioner of public safety, with the assistance of the state fire marshal, shall adopt rules containing fire-retardant cigarette standards before July 1, 2003. The standards must:

(1) ensure that cigarettes meet a fire-retardant cigarette performance standard that limits the risk that a cigarette will ignite upholstered furniture, mattresses, or other household furnishings; and

(2) ensure that cigarettes, if ignited, will stop burning within a time period specified by the standard if the cigarettes are not smoked during that period.

(b) Six months following the adoption of the rules required in paragraph (a), all cigarettes sold, offered for sale, or manufactured in this state must comply with these rules.

(c) A person engaged in the manufacture of cigarettes shall submit to the state fire marshal, in writing and before any sale in this state, certification that the manufacturer's products meet the standards required under paragraph (a).

Subd. 2. [CONDITIONAL REPEALER.] If federal fire-retardant cigarette standards are enacted that preempt this section, this section is repealed on the day those federal standards take effect.

Sec. 2. [EFFECTIVE DATE.]

Section 1 is effective the day following final enactment."

Delete the title and insert:

"A bill for an act relating to fire safety; requiring the commissioner of public safety to adopt rules for fire-retardant standards for cigarettes; prohibiting the sale of cigarettes not meeting these standards; proposing coding for new law in Minnesota Statutes, chapter 299F."

And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on State and Local Government Operations. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.

**Senator Ranum from the Committee on Crime Prevention, to which was referred**

**S.F. No. 229:** A bill for an act relating to criminal records; requiring that crime victims be notified of expungement proceedings and allowed to submit a statement; amending Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 609A.03, subdivisions 2, 3, and 4.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

Page 2, line 26, after "on" insert ": (1)"

Page 2, line 28 after "order" insert a semicolon and delete "on" and insert "(2)"

Page 2, line 29, after "sought" insert "who can be located with reasonable efforts"

[TECHNOLOGY ROOM RATE INCREASE.] Within the limits of appropriations made specifically for this purpose, the commissioner shall approve rate increases of up to \$25,000 to nursing facilities to configure and equip technology rooms that accommodate computers with access to the Internet, printers, and related electronic equipment. For the rate year beginning July 1, 2001, or July 1, 2002, the property-related payment rate for a facility reimbursed under this section or section 256B.434 and approved for a rate increase for a technology room shall be adjusted to reflect the amount of the rate increase.

Sec. 2. [APPROPRIATION.]

\$...... is appropriated from the general fund to the commissioner of human services for the biennium beginning July 1, 2001, for the purposes of section 1."

Delete the title and insert:

"A bill for an act relating to health; establishing a grant program for nursing facility technology rooms; appropriating money; amending Minnesota Statutes 2000, section 256B.431, by adding a subdivision."

And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on Finance. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.

**Senator Sams from the Committee on Health and Family Security, to which was referred**

**S.F. No. 58:** A bill for an act relating to health; instructing the revisor of statutes to change a phrase concerning mental illness.

No. 480:** A bill for an act relating to traffic regulations; abolishing statutes that define trackless trolley car, that regulate driving through rough country, and that prohibit employment by passenger carriers of persons addicted to liquor; repealing Minnesota Statutes 2000, sections 169.01, subdivision 18; 169.38; and 169.901.
