Senator Gazelka moved that the Committee Reports at the Desk be now adopted. The motion prevailed.

Senator Abeler from the Committee on Human Services Reform Finance and Policy, to which was referred

S.F. No. 17: A bill for an act relating to human services; directing the commissioner of human services to allocate money returned from the federal court; appropriating money.

Reports the same back with the recommendation that the bill be amended as follows:

Delete everything after the enacting clause and insert:

"Section 1. **RETURN OF PAYMENTS FOR JENSEN SETTLEMENT COSTS.**

If the state receives funds disbursed from the United States District Court for the District of Minnesota registry related to Jensen v. Minnesota Department of Human Services, Civ. No. 09-1775 (DWF/BRT), then the commissioner shall deposit the disbursed funds into an account in the general fund, and the balance of the account is appropriated to the commissioner of human services for the disability services system reform efforts of the Disability Services Division. The commissioner of human services shall allocate all of these funds to the operating budget of the Disability Services Division. By January 1, 2023, the commissioner of human services shall report to the chairs and ranking minority members of the legislative committees and divisions with jurisdiction over human services on the uses of the funds appropriated under this section.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective retroactively from December 6, 2020."

And when so amended the bill do pass and be re-referred to the Committee on Finance. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.

Senator Pratt from the Committee on Jobs and Economic Growth Finance and Policy, to which was referred

Page 1, after line 4, insert:

"Section 1. Laws 2020, chapter 71, article 2, section 24, is amended to read:

Sec. 24. COMPUTATION OF FUTURE TAX RATE; EFFECT OF PAYMENT FROM TRUST FUND.

Notwithstanding Minnesota Statutes, section 268.047, subdivision 1, unemployment insurance benefits paid as a result of an applicant not being able to work directly or indirectly as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic will not be used in computing the future unemployment insurance tax rate of a taxpaying employer. This section expires December 31, 2020. Unemployment insurance benefits paid under this section must not be used in any experience rating computation required under Minnesota Statutes, section 268.051, subdivision 3, in any calendar year that occurs following enactment of this section.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This section is effective the day following final enactment."

Renumber the sections in sequence

Amend the title as follows:

Page 1, line 2, after the semicolon, insert "eliminating expiration date for exclusion of COVID-19-related unemployment claims in calculating future experience rating;"

Amend the title numbers accordingly

And when so amended the bill do pass. Amendments adopted. Report adopted.
