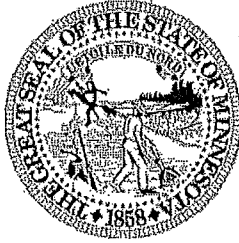

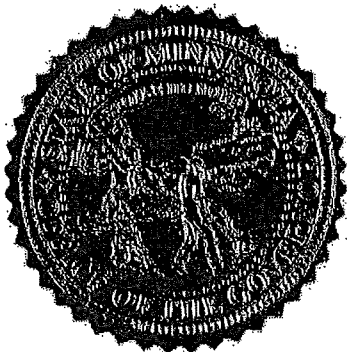

Roger Moe obtained a Bachelor of Science degree from Mayville State (North Dakota) University where he majored in Education, followed by graduate studies at Moorhead State University and North Dakota State University in Education Administration. The University of Minnesota presented Roger with an Honorary Doctor of Laws Degree for his years of public service. He has been inducted into Crookston Central High School Hall of Fame, Mayville State University Distinguished Alumni and Athletic Hall of Fame. In 1978 the Minnesota Jaycees selected Roger as one of "Ten Outstanding Young Minnesotans".

Roger Moe was elected to the Legislature in 1970 and represented Northwestern Minnesota's 2nd Senate District. In 1975 and 1976 He chaired the Senate Agriculture and Natural Resources Committee. He has also been Chair of the Finance Committee and was the youngest person in Minnesota's history to chair this important committee. Moe served until January 2003 and was the longest serving Senate Majority Leader in the history of the state serving in that position for 22 years.

He was the Democratic candidate for Lt. Governor in 1998 and Governor in 2002.

His numerous legislative achievements include the landmark measure streamlining of state higher education through creation of the Minnesota State Colleges and University System (MnSCU), champion of quality K-12 education and high standards, the Minnesota Job Skills Partnership, the Midwest Higher Education Commission, and author of the Environmental Trust Fund.

Before becoming a legislator, Moe taught mathematics and coached at Ada High School. He is president of his own consulting company: National Strategies Inc. Moe also served on the board of directors of Debate Minnesota and the Policy Consensus Initiative as well as numerous non-profit boards. In December 2016 Governor Mark Dayton appointed Moe to the M-State Colleges and Universities board of trustees of which he is currently the vice-chair. Governor Tim Walz appointed Moe to the MN Board on Aging in 2019. Roger makes his home in rural Erskine and has four children and five grandchildren.

Among his priorities are:

Rural Minnesota—A lifelong resident of rural Minnesota Roger Moe understands the diversity of economies, cultures, concerns and opportunities in Greater Minnesota. During tough economic times in the mid 80's he championed the Minnesota Economic Development Act. Landmark legislation that linked public and private resources in research and economic development to diversify the rural economy established the Rural Development Board and created the Agricultural Utilization Research Institute. Moe creatively used rural development funds as challenge grants to rural regions of Minnesota that have evolved into the Regional Initiative Funds. Moe was the creator of the Minnesota Jobs Skills Partnership the most cost effective labor retraining program in the state. He also authored legislation that streamlined state universities, community colleges and technical colleges into one system, now called the Minnesota State Colleges and Universities (MnSCU). Moe was appointed to the MnSCU Citizens Advisory Commission which focused on strategic planning. Senator Moe has strived to preserve Minnesota's pristine natural resources. He was the chief author of legislation that created the Environmental Trust Fund, which is a national model for environmental protection and conservation, and pushed for legislation to restore and preserve Minnesota's wetlands. His legislation that created Housing Redevelopment Authorities and the Public Facilities Authority have resulted in better housing, wastewater treatment, water and sewer systems, district heating and health care facilities

Maintaining Minnesota's role as a national and world leader—Roger Moe has represented the state's interests both nationally and abroad. He recently completed a term as Chairman of the Policy Consensus Initiative (PCI), a national nonprofit program working with leaders at the state and local level to establish and strengthen the use of collaborative practices in states to bring about more effective governance. He has served on the executive committees of both the Midwestern Conference of the Council of State Governments and the National Council of State Governments, and as a member of the International Committee and the Budget Committee of the Council of State Governments. Senator Moe has taught seminars on local government in Latvia and Lithuania, led two delegations of legislators and business leaders to promote trade and economic development and represented Minnesota in more than seventeen foreign countries for diplomatic and economic purposes.

Active citizenship—Roger Moe has encouraged citizens to become more involved in the legislative process. Under Moe's leadership, in 1999 the Senate Majority Caucus hosted the first "virtual" town meeting on the Internet ever conducted on an official government website. In 1995 Senator Moe and former Lt. Governor Joanne Benson developed the Active Citizenship Initiative: Generations Working Together to promote public responsibility and participation in government. Since its inception, over 600 individuals and 100 organizations and businesses have participated in the Active Citizenship program. Since leaving elective office Roger Moe has made numerous presentations to legislators from many states about collaborative governance and the power to convene.

The Gillette Children's Hospital's **Lifetime Achievement Award**, the Minnesota YMCA's **Youth in Government Award**, the United Way of Minneapolis Area's **Success by 6 Honors** for his dedication to children's issues; **commendations** from Governor Arne Carlson and the Regents of the University of Minnesota, and the University of Minnesota-Crookston's **Golden Torch Award** for commitment to quality education.
